<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Focus on reach from the beginning (WHO) 2. Design and select interventions with implement in mind (What) 3. Implement what works (How) 4. Develop the science of adaptations 5. Use an equity lens for implementation outcomes 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Shift IS terminology to place different perspectives on equal footing <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How teams use language - labels, 'othering', complexity, density/opacity 2. Employ strategies and build structures that elevate equity concerns <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How teams diagnose their entry point and dynamics around the reasons and forces that brought us there. 3. Cultivate relationship and trust <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Teams as a vehicle for building trust 4. Shift funding incentives to value practice expertise and question <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exert influence to change external and internal incentives 5.
